About REC:

Riverside Education Centers (REC) is a private, non-profit corporation 501(c)(3) that has been serving the community since 2006, providing structured tutoring and diverse enrichment activities in the after-school hours for academically and financially qualifying 1st-12th grade students in order to improve academic achievement and foster positive social and emotional development in a safe and supportive environment.

Job Summary:

The After School Program Volunteer position requires individuals interested in impacting the lives of students through academic, enrichment, and social and emotional support activities. Each Volunteer

will engage in one-on-one or small group tutoring sessions in the after-school hours and through enrichment activities both on and off site.

Physical demands associated with this position may include: sitting, standing, walking, alternative sitting or standing at will, lifting or carrying up to 25lbs, pushing/pulling, stooping, crouching, kneeling, crawling, and or climbing.

Responsibilities:

- Ability to explain material in multiple ways
- Sets small goals/breaks down assignments into achievable pieces if necessary
- Follows the daily schedule
- Reviews student's work to ensure quality
- Keeps students focused and on-task
- Praises/recognizes students in appropriate ways
- Communicates with Site Manager daily on schedule of programming and student needs and concerns
- Assist students one-on-one OR a small group (1-5 students), during program time with homework and structured academic support.
- Engage with students one-on-one OR a small group (1-5 students), to mentor and develop a positive relationship.
- Collaborate with site staff for discipline and behavior issues
- Other duties as assigned.

Qualifications:

- Strong academic knowledge base
- Ability to interact with people of all ages and cultural backgrounds
- Ability to work independently and as part of a team
- Effective oral and written communication skills
- Prefer an individual who has experience working with assisting youth overcome barriers
- True desire to impact the lives of children in our community
- Bilingual skills beneficial, but not mandatory

- Elementary School Programming runs Tue-Thur 3:45-6:30 pm & Fri 1:45-6:30 pm (early release day) + occasional 3-4 additional hours/month (Saturdays or Mondays when kids are off school-to be scheduled in advance) Pear Park Elementary runs Tue-Thur 3:20-6:15 pm & Fri 1:30-6:15 pm
- <u>Middle Schools: Mon-Thur 3:00-6:00 pm</u> + occasional 3-4 additional hours/month-to be scheduled in advance (Saturdays or Mondays when kids are off school).
- <u>High Schools: Mon-Thur 3:00-5:30 pm</u> + occasional 3-4 additional hours/month-to be scheduled in advance (Saturdays or Mondays when kids are off school).

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
